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RULES FOR BRADLEY COOK SCRATCH TEAM & PARALLEL PLATE COMPETITION

1. **Format:** 5 a-side Scratch Team Competition initially played in a Round Robin format. The winning team in each group will proceed to the knock-out phase of the Bradley Cook. The runners-up in each group will proceed to the knockout phase of the Parallel Plate. Matches to be played Home and Away at all stages up to, but not including, the Final. Matches must be played in playing handicap order and where possible commence from the 1st tee.
Only one entry per club.
2. **Entry Fee:** £10.00 per club.
3. **Eligibility:** All players **must** have a competition handicap and be members of a club affiliated to the KCLGA. Any player playing in a final, must have played at least twice in the current year's competition prior to the final No player may represent more than one club during the course of the event.
4. **Where a Club has more than one Course:** Once a course is agreed upon when the match is booked, this must be upheld.
5. **Seeded Clubs:** Finalists and Semi finalists will be placed in opposite sides of the draw the following year.
6. **Green Fees:** If a green fee has to be paid it will be shared.
7. **Caddies:** Must be amateur members of a club affiliated to the County.
8. **Golf Carts** (Buggies): Only allowed on production of a medical certificate or if the player is over 80 (subject to the Club's availability) and the County Organiser must be notified.
9. **General Rule:** When a trolley ban exists it must apply to members of both teams - whether home or away. Medical dispensation not accepted.
10. **Dates and Tee times offered:** Each team to make contact and confirm dates within six weeks of the date of the initial draw. At the time of contact, **at least** four dates, spread over a minimum of four weeks, **must** be offered and **must** include one week day and three weekend dates.
In the knockout stages, each team to make contact and **offer**, within two weeks of the draw, four dates spread over not less than two weeks, which must include one midweek and three weekend dates.

Bank Holidays are classed as weekend dates.

Should a team fail to make contact, within 21 days for the round robin stage and 14 days for the knockout stage, the opposing team may claim **HOME** advantage for both legs of the match.

Matches to commence between 9.00 am and 3.00 pm

11. **Completion Dates:** Each round **must** be completed on time. No extensions will be allowed.
12. **Substitutes:** If any player is more than 30 minutes late from the commencement of the first match, she shall forfeit her match unless a reserve is available.
13. **Results:** Each individual game **must** be played to a **CONCLUSION**. Placings at the end of the round robin will be decided on the number of overall matches won. If there is a tie, the result shall be decided on the number of individual games won and then the number of holes won. Should there still be a tie, the number of holes won in the matches between the tied teams will decide the winner. In the event of a tie in the knockout stages, the result will be decided on the total number of **holes** won. If a tie still exists, each team must nominate one person to play sudden death.

The result of each match to be emailed, to the County Organiser, by both teams, within 48 hours. **If the match is played on the last date, the result must be telephoned immediately and confirmed by email.**

If a match is conceded, the score for that match will be 6 and 5.

14. **Finals Day:**
Bradley Cook - The final will take place on a course and date specified by KCLGA in the presence of a referee from the KCLGA. **PLAYERS ARE REQUIRED TO CHANGE FOR THE PRESENTATION AND TEA**, unless otherwise advised on the day.

Parallel Plate - The final of this competition will be played in conjunction with the above.
15. **Trophies:** Will be presented to the winners on Finals Day to be held for one year. The winning club will receive a memento and the Runners Up a framed certificate.

16. **Thunderstorms:** In the event of a storm, players should mark their balls, return to the Clubhouse and resume play as soon as possible. If the course remains closed for the day, the match shall be rearranged and play shall commence on the tee of the incomplete hole.
17. **Practice Rounds:** Practice Rounds are at the discretion of the club and permission should be sought from the Manager/Secretary prior to the game.
18. **Clubs must play both the Home and Away matches or may face exclusion from the following year's Competition.**
19. The Committee's decision is final if any incident, not covered in these rules, occur.

For competitors under 18 years of age on the day of the competition the parent/guardian must have completed an Annual Junior Player Profile Form and Code of Conduct for Children, without which the entry cannot be accepted.

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RULES FOR THE CHAMPION OF CHAMPIONS MEDAL COMPETITION

A competition open to Club Champions.

1. **Format:** 18 hole qualifying stroke play. The Champion of Champions Cup will be awarded to the best Scratch score and a prize for the best Nett score. Should there be a tie then a sudden death play-off will commence from the 1st Tee.
2. **Eligibility:** Open to all Lady Club Champions of preceding year, but only **one entry** per club.
3. **Substitutes:** If the Club Champion is unable to play the runner-up may take her place.
4. **Entry Fee:** £45.00 which includes 18 holes of golf for the Champion and a meal for her. Additional meals for caddy/Lady Captain must be ordered and paid for at the time of entry (31 March). Cost of meal for Lady Captain/caddy is £17.00

It is hoped and expected that all players and their representatives will stay for the Presentation and Meal.

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RULES FOR THE COOMBE CUP VETERAN FOURSOMES COMPETITION

1. **Format:** Knockout Foursomes tournament off handicap for players aged **68 years and over on 1 February 2017. (MID-WEEK ONLY)**. Handicap allowance **half** of the difference of combined handicaps.
2. **Entry Fee:** £5.00 per pair
3. **Eligibility:** All players **must** have a competition handicap and be members of a club affiliated to the KCLGA. No player may represent more than one club during the course of the event.
4. **Where a Club has more than one Course:** Once a course is agreed upon when the match is booked, this must be upheld.
5. **Draw:** The initial draw will cover the whole Competition and details will be sent to all clubs concerned. In the first round the top team of each match will play at home, after which there will be a draw to decide which team will play at home or away - notification will be sent to the club organisers advising them the outcome of the draw.

Should a club already have had two consecutive home draws, then they will automatically play away in the following round – unless their opposition is in the same position, when a draw will be made in the usual way.
6. **Green Fees:** If a green fee has to be paid, it will be shared.
7. **Caddies:** must be amateur members of a club affiliated to the County. As a matter of courtesy, please notify your opponents in advance if you are having a caddy
8. **Golf Carts** (Buggies): Only allowed on production of a medical certificate or if the player is over 80 (subject to the Club's availability) and the County Organiser must be notified.
9. **General Rule:** When a trolley ban exists it must apply to members of both teams - whether home or away. Medical dispensation not accepted. Matches **must** be played in accordance with 'Tees and Greens of the Day' and commence at the 1st Tee **where possible**.
10. **Dates Offered:** Home team to make contact and **offer at least** three midweek dates, spread over not less than two weeks. Should the Home team not contact the Away team within a fortnight of the relevant draw being made, the Away

team may choose the venue, but **must** at the time of contact **offer** three dates, spread over not less than two weeks.

11. **Completion Dates:** Each round **must** be completed on time. No extensions will be allowed.
12. **Replacement/Substitute:** If after the draw has been made and before any matches are played, an unfit player may be **replaced**. After the competition has started a player may only be **substituted** with the authority of the County Organiser.
13. **Results:** The result of each match to be emailed, to the County Organiser by both teams within 48 hours. **If the match is played on the last date, the result must be telephoned immediately.**
14. **Finals Day:** The final will take place on a course and date specified by KCLGA in the presence of a referee from the KCLGA. **PLAYERS ARE REQUIRED TO CHANGE FOR THE PRESENTATION AND TEA** unless otherwise advised on the day.
15. **Trophy:** Will be presented to the winners on Finals Day to be held for one year. The winning club will receive a memento and the Runners Up a framed certificate.
16. **Thunderstorms:** In the event of a storm, players should mark their balls, return to the Clubhouse and resume play as soon as possible. If the course remains closed for the day, the match shall be rearranged and play shall commence on the tee of the incomplete hole.
17. **Practice Rounds:** Practice Rounds are at the discretion of the club and permission should be sought from the Manager/Secretary prior to the game.
18. The Committee's decision is final if any incident, not covered in these rules, occurs.

RULES FOR THE CAPTAINS' CUP MIXED FOURSOMES COMPETITION

*This competition was inaugurated when Chris and Elaine Tappin were both captains of Kent at the same time – **competitors do not have to be current or past captains of the club they represent.***

1. **Format:** Knock-out tournament off handicap with 2 mixed foursomes pairs from the same club per team. First pair to include a gentleman with a handicap **plus to 14** and a lady from the **Silver Division (plus to 20)**. Second pair to include a gentleman with a handicap **15 to 28** and a lady from the **Bronze Division (21 to 36)**. If a replacement is needed during the competition, it must be in the correct handicap band. If a player's handicap changes during the competition and moves out of the band, he or she is no longer eligible to play in that band.

If, after the **first round**, a team has to play a substitute for a Silver player and is genuinely unable to field a player with a Silver handicap, they may use a player with a higher handicap, but he/she must play off a Silver division handicap – i.e. 14 for men, 20 for ladies. **Such substitution may only be made with the prior agreement of the County Organiser.**

Handicap allowance **half** of the difference in combined handicaps.

Only one entry per club.

2. **Entry Fee: £10.00 per Club.**
3. **Eligibility:** All players **must** have a competition handicap and be members of a club affiliated to the KCLGA or KGU. No player may represent more than one club during the course of the event.
4. **Where a Club has more than one Course:** Once a course is agreed upon when the match is booked this must be upheld.
5. **Draw:** The initial draw will cover the whole Competition and details will be sent to all Lady Captains of the clubs concerned. In the first round the top team of each match will play at home, after which there will be a draw to decide which team will play at home - notification will be sent to all club organisers advising them the outcome of the draw.

Should a club already have had two consecutive home draws, then they will automatically play away in the following round – unless their opposition is in the same position, when a draw will be made in the usual way.

6. **Green Fees:** If a green fee has to be paid, it will be shared.
7. **Caddies:** must be amateur members of a club affiliated to the County.
8. **Golf Carts** (Buggies): Only allowed on production of a medical certificate or if the player is over 80 (subject to the Club's availability) and the County Organiser must be notified.
9. **General Rule:** When a trolley ban exists it **must** apply to members of both teams - whether home or away. Medical dispensation not accepted. Matches should be played in accordance with 'Tees and Greens of the Day' and commence at the 1st Tee **where possible**, men off white tees and ladies off red tees.
10. **Dates Offered:** Home team to make contact and **offer at least** three dates, both midweek and weekend dates, spread over not less than two weeks. Should the Home team not contact the Away team within a fortnight of the **relevant** draw being **made** the Away team may choose the venue, but **must** at the time of contact offer three dates, spread over not less than two weeks, which must include both mid-week and weekend dates.
11. **Completion Dates:** Each round **must** be completed on time. No extensions will be allowed.
12. **The Match:** Each individual foursomes match to be played over the complete 18 holes. Handicap Allowance in a game will be half of the difference between each pair's combined handicaps. **The match to be played from the Men's Stroke Indices.** The winning club will be determined by the aggregate of holes won or lost by the two pairs after **all 18 holes** have been played by each pair. In the event of a tie, the lower handicap foursomes pairs will play sudden death.
13. **Results:** The result of each match emailed, to the County Organiser by both teams within 48 hours. **If the match is played on the last date, the result must be telephoned immediately.**
14. **Finals Day:** Will be administered by the KGU in conjunction with the Kent Foursomes and Kent Junior Foursomes. **PLAYERS ARE REQUIRED TO CHANGE FOR THE PRESENTATION AND TEA** unless otherwise advised on the day.

15. **Trophies:** Will be presented to the winners on Finals Day to be held for one year. The winning club will receive a memento and the Runners Up a framed certificate.
16. **Thunderstorms:** In the event of a storm, players should mark their balls, return to the clubhouse and resume play as soon as possible. If the course remains closed for the day, the match shall be rearranged and play shall commence on the tee of the incomplete hole. **Original handicaps prevail.**
17. **Practice Rounds:** Practice Rounds are at the discretion of the club and permission should be sought from the Manager/Secretary prior to the game
18. The Committee's decision is final if any incident, not covered in these rules, occurs

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RULES FOR THE THREE FEATHERS MATCHPLAY TOURNAMENT

1. **Format:** Individual Knockout tournament off handicap for players aged **18 years and over** in 3 divisions, **Plus-15 16-22 23-35** (36 handicaps not eligible). Handicap allowance **full** difference in handicap. If a player's handicap increases and is outside the limit of the division, she must play off the maximum handicap in that division. If a player's handicap reduces and is below the handicap range, she must stay in the division but play off her new handicap.

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RULES FOR THE WINTER FOURBALL MATCHPLAY COMPETITION (MID-WEEK ONLY)

1. **Format:** Fourball betterball “round robin” competition with the winners of each group progressing to a knockout tournament for the final stages. Matches are played off handicap (**90%** handicap allowance), home and away, playing handicap **plus to 14 at closing date of entry.**

Each team will play the other teams in their group both home and away, receiving 4 points for an away win, 3 points for a home win, 2 points for an away draw and 1 point for a home draw. If two teams are tied at the top of their group after all matches have been completed, the results of the matches between those two teams will decide the winner.
